A WORD FROM THE DEPARTMENTS

Fire Department



Don't let a fire ruin your holidays!

The risk of fire remains present even during the holidays. The firemen of your Fire Department, in collaboration with the ministry of public safety, remind you to always be vigilant and remember these few pieces of advice to ensure your safety and the safety of your loved ones.

Smoke detector

- ⇒ Check to make sure your smoke detector is functioning. If it is defective or has been in place for more than 10 years, replace it.

Natural Christmas tree

- ⇒ Choose a tree with green needles that don't come off easily;
- ⇒ Set it up at least one metre from any heat source such as an electric register or a fireplace.
- ⇒ Keep the foot of the tree always wet by adding water every day.
- ⇒ Always turn off the tree lights when leaving your home.

Decorative lights

- ⇒ Use CSA or ULC decorative lights;
- ⇒ Install decorative lights especially made for outdoors for your outside decorations.
- ⇒ Use string lights that are in good condition, not split or dried up. Affix lights with insulating tape and never use nails or thumbtacks.

Candles

- ⇒ Light your candles far from curtains or any flammable object.
- ⇒ Never leave lighted candles unattended.
- ⇒ Make sure your candle holders are fire proof and that their base is stable.
- ⇒ Keep matches and lighters out of reach of children..

Town planning

Night parking

It is prohibited to park on a public road between midnight and 6 am from November 15 to April 15 on the entire territory of the Municipality.

Ice and snow

It is prohibited to throw ice or snow from a private property to the street or any other public place..

(Bylaw #478, article #10)

Installing a polyethylene membrane

It is possible to install a polyethylene membrane on your property (and not on the street right-of-way) in the fall to make it easier to remove abrasives (crushed stones, sand and salt) that could accumulate on your lot during snow removal. The Municipality is not responsible for damages to the membranes.

Stairs, doors, porches and access

After a snowfall, carefully shovel and deice your stairs, doors and porches especially if they are used as emergency exits.

Snow removal on the roof

As a preventative measure to ensure the public safety, the Régie du bâtiment du Québec (RBQ) recommends to property owners to:

- * Remove snow accumulated on the roof to avoid risks of collapse.
- * Take necessary measures to ensure the safety of people who circulate near your building;
- * Pay special attention to snow on vaulted or rounded roofs, especially if the snow is not evenly distributed.

You have work to do?

Foresee requesting your permit one month before the date you expect the work to start.

L'ASSOCIATION POUR LA SAUVEGARDE DU LAC SAINT-FRANÇOIS (ASLSF)

The Association pour la sauvegarde du lac Saint-François (ASLSF) held its annual general meeting with part of its members in attendance for the first time since 2019, on Sunday, October 2, 2022 at the Saint-Anicet community centre. With the help of a display screen presentation, the members of the board of directors showed the major stakes and the steps taken to safeguard the water quality of lake Saint-François. Project to characterize the water quality on the south bank of the lake

During the summer of 2021, the ASLSF hired the firm Zone d'Intervention Prioritaire (ZIP) du Haut-Saint-Laurent to realize a project to characterize the water quality on the south bank of the lake. This project covered the bank from Dundee to Saint-Stanislas-de-Kostka. In all, 15 sites were sampled 12 times from March 2021 to October 2021.

This sampling uncovered certain problems and allowed the concerning situation about the water quality on the bank of the lake to be seen. Among others, in certain times, excesses to the norms established by the environment ministry were noted for phosphorus, E.Coli, suspended solids and ammonia nitrogen.

La Guerre River file

The problem is to find a solution to the problem existing for more than forty years that can satisfy the different interests of the farmers who drain their fields and the riparians who want to safeguard the quality of the water of the lake.

The ASLSF continues its work to solve the pollution of the lake problem by the pumping of a yearly average of 16 million gallons US that is nearly 6 million cubic meters of water from the La Guerre River to the lake. This untreated pumped water which contains varied matters from agricultural land such as chemical fertilizers, contributes to the deterioration of the water quality of the lake.

The ASLSF hopes that there is a real political will to solve this problem once and for all. The file is now in the hands of the Haut-Saint-Laurent MRC who requested this fall a bathymetric report from the firm Tetrattech which is an important step for solving the problems linked to the pumping of the water from La Guerre River to Lake Saint-François.

Project Saint-François 2030

The ASLSF worked to have a master plan and indicators for 2022-2030. This document describes the main stakes concerning the maintaining and improvement of the water quality on the south bank of Lake Saint-François. It also names the ASLSF objectives regarding each of the seven (7) stakes retained as well as the measurable indicators and the required steps from the ASLSF in the short and long term.


