AGRICULTURAL PORTRAIT

It's spring, the nice weather is back! Nature comes alive and it's the beginning of a lot of hard work for the farmers of our region. It's a race against the clock to prepare the ground, apply fertilizers and minerals, seed, water and weeding. All is planned months in advance, but they will have to adapt on a day to day basis to the demands of Mother Nature. It's not wise to start working the soil when it's still damp or too cold since this hinders the structure of the soil and will affect the harvest. However, each day seeding is postponed, that's one less day of growth for the plant. Also, some crops prefer a cool soil and others are more adapted to warmth. It's an exhausting time, the short nights and days will be repeated over numerous weeks. The tractors and their drivers will only stop to get fresh supplies in order to take maximum advantage of the nice weather. Tractors and farming machinery traffic will increase on the roads and may represent a danger to both motorists and farmers. Even if the risk is reduced by the various visible signs on equipment, we must still be aware and remain cautious. It's important to keep a safe distance due to blind spots and to leave enough space to manoeuver on the road.

Be patient, if you're following a tractor, know that it's not too far for it to reach it's destination!

INSPECTOR'S CORNER

Bylaw concerning fire prevention

A form that needs to be filled out is now available to request a permit for an open air fire.

-Here are the new norms concerning open air fires.

♦ In the agricultural zone: The maximum height of a fire is 3 meters and its area must not exceed a 12-meter diameter. It must be located at least 30 meters from the end of the property, from any building, from any flammable materials, from brush, from a forest as well as any tree or hedge.

♦ In the white zone: The maximum height of a fire is 1 meter and its area must not exceed a 2-meter diameter and must be located at least 5 meters from the property line, from any building, from any flammable material, from brush, from a forest as well as from any tree or hedge.

Temporary shelter

Since April 15th, all temporary shelters must be taken down..

Delay in obtaining a permit

According to the bylaw, please allow for a delay of up to four weeks from the application of your request to the urban development office and the reception of your permit.

STRAY CAT STERILIZATION POLICY

Following a decision by the municipal councillors, the stray cat sterilization policy will be suspended for this year but remains under study.

We will take note of any requests for cat sterilization so as to do a follow-up to establish the demand.

They will thus be better informed on the situation for next year.

The cat sterilization policy has certain restrictions as follows:

- The cat is admissible to the program if it is a stray, the intervener will determine if it is a stray and belonging to the community or tamed and adoptable.
- If the citizen is attached to this cat and wishes to keep it, he will then be able to adopt it with the fees and modes of adoption attached.
- A healthy cat will be sterilized and a tattoo on its ear will identify it as such.
- A sick or emaciated cat, will be euthanized humanely by the veterinarian. This cat, being wild, cannot be treated.
- Shelter cats are not eligible for the program.

The service offered concerns sterilization or adoption. It does not include mileage for the municipality or the intervener to pick up the cat.



Stabilizing plants and trees giveaway.

The annual distribution of plants and trees will be May 12, 2018 from 9 am to 11 am at the **municipal garage located at 5001 route 132**. Bring your plants to exchange with others. Your plants must be identified and placed in pots or in a bag. Bring containers, bags or newspapers for the transportation of the plants and trees. We will have trees but we don't know the species at this time. The following stabilizing plants that will be offered this year are:.

WANTED: FIRST RESPONDERS

First Responders.

Who are they?

- Anyone 18 or over, residing in the Municipality of Saint-Anicet, dynamic, liking team work, concerned with the health of people and who wishes to commit to his or her fellow citizens.

What does a First Responder do?

- He answers swiftly to any request from the health communication dispatch;
- He evaluates and gives the necessary emergency care that the status of the victim requires;
- He acts according to the operational protocols preestablished to prevent a deterioration of the state of the victim until the arrival of the ambulance and this, under the chain of intervention of the prehospitalization emergency system within the limits of the Municipality of Saint-Anicet.

When are First Responders called?

- First Responders intervene in all important emergency situations: environmental problems, industrial problems, medical problems, obstetrical problems, pediatric problems or traumas.

What is the required training?

- When the candidate is hired, he will follow the First Responder training which is 60 hours.


