

Dear residents of Saint-Anicet,

As to the future, it's not a question of foreseeing it but of making it possible. Antoine de Saint-Exupéry

Summer is near! It will be a nice summer as we work to conquer Covid-19 and its impact on our community. Summer in Saint-Anicet is a marvelous and vibrant time. Let's hope that the loosening of the health measures will allow us private or public meetings. I urge all citizens to get vaccinated so that we can benefit from this summer.

The new construction at the elementary school Des-Jeunes-Riverains is almost over. The Municipality foresees working on an agreement in principle with the Centre de services scolaires de la Vallée-des-Tisserands so that the new gym can be used for sporting or social activities.

The various municipal committees have been active in the last months. We have asked for citizen participation on each committee. It's very important to have municipal committees that include citizens to ensure the follow-up and continuity for coming years and this will avoid that policies and projects stay on the shelf. Thanks to all who get involved, you offer a great potential for the development of our Municipality.

In 2019, the Municipality held public consultations to learn about the stakes of private roads and canals. These consultations led to the creation of committees who worked on more complete and multi-purpose guides. On May 22, 2021, the private roads committee presented a report on the work to the representatives. Each private road has its challenges and constraints and we must work together to offer the best services to the citizens of our beautiful Municipality.

Some residents, who have a property adjacent to a canal, created a OBNL and private group on Facebook in order to find lasting and economical solutions for the maintenance of all canals.

The municipal committee, friends of seniors (MADA), published a poll on line to better understand the challenges and needs of our community. To follow up on the answers to this poll, the MADA committee will propose an action plan to the councillors to adapt our services and infrastructures to take into account an aging population and favor healthy living habits. A municipality, friend of seniors, optimizes the health opportunities, of participation and safety to improve the quality of life according to the stages of the aging of citizens.

To realize the MADA action plan, we ask that all citizens contribute, to keep our seniors in their homes as long as possible. The government announces that more money will be given to maintain and offer home services. I wish that our seniors have a wonderful quality of life in Saint-Anicet.

In closing, I cannot insist enough.... Continue to encourage our local businesses where you can and continue to follow the security protocol as recommended. In my name and in the name of the council, I wish you a most enjoyable and safe summer!

PESTICIDES

The use of pesticides is to protect crops from harmful insects, weeds and plant disease. Without them, entire harvests could be destroyed and cause heavy production losses, therefore, fewer available raw materials and consequently, an increase in the cost of food.

In addition to not applying any product, the farmer must respect distances between where the pesticides are spread and buildings, water courses, water sample sites, bike paths. The watchword of the Quebec pesticide plan is to reduce its use in agriculture and replace them with techniques and health-safe products, biodiversity, the quality of surface and underground water. Since in addition to ensuring the viability of their business, farmers must preserve the environment, healthy foods as well as the health of the population.

Historical society summer

We were very pleased to obtain a subsidy from Canada Summer Employment for two students and we are going to hire Méliane Weaner (third summer working for us) and Selena Zena for the 2021 summer. We will certainly make them work on the management of our archives and on collecting information for our agricultural heritage inventory project. On that note, we are continuing to work with Edith Prigent who will work as project manager and will benefit from \$2,500 given by Claire Isabelle, Huntingdon MNA, from her discretionary budget. Finally, our premises will be open on Saturdays, from 11 am to 4 pm from June 26 to August 14. We are presently preparing an exhibition on the heritage sites of the municipality and will have a counter to sell local products and promotional items (mugs, books, etc.) Health measures will be in place.

SMALL REMINDER

GREEN WASTE SITE

The green waste site is located at 4000 Neuf Road, open from Friday noon to Monday noon.

Leaves, branches, seaweeds and grass only.

No trash should be left behind, we ask that you take back your containers, bags, boxes, etc.

CONSTRUCTION MATERIAL WASTE SITE

For 2021, each property is allowed **ONE free pass** for the construction material waste site. This pass is valid for a trailer 4' x 8' or a pickup style truck. To get this service, you can call the office of the Town Hall or contact communication@stanicet.com to get your pass. Open on the 1st and 3rd Saturday of each month from 8 am to noon.

GARAGE SALES of June 25, 26 and 27 and July 23, 24 and 25 2021.

Garage sales on private property can be held as long as health measures are respected according to the date of the event and the level that we will be at.

Orange level: maximum 12 persons (including sellers) at a time, with mask and distancing:

Yellow level: maximum 12 persons (including sellers) at a time with distancing only;

Green level: maximum 50 persons (including sellers) at a time with distancing only.

INSPECTOR'S CORNER

Grass and brush

Grass and brush must be cut so that they do not exceed the allowed height of 20 cm, with the exception of agricultural land and waterfront protection strip.

Permit requests

You have construction projects for your property? There are specific norms for the installation or the construction of a building (house, garage, shed, pool, wharf, etc.) and obtaining a permit or certificate is needed for the majority of this work. We now have information brochures for certain projects that are available on our web site to help you prepare your permit request: <https://stanicet.com/permis>. Forms for permit requests are also available on the same link.

Make plans to complete your permit request a few weeks before the date that work begins. The bylaw allows a 30 day delay to issue a permit or authorization certificate from the time the completed request is left at the office of the Town Hall.

Construction, installation or replacement of a pool (including a pool that can be dismantled)

A municipal permit is required to construct, install or replace a pool (including a pool that can be dismantled) and to construct a structure giving or preventing access. Here are a few rules to follow concerning pools:

- All access doors to the pool must have a safety device that self-closes and locks automatically;
- that all terraces adjacent to a pool must be equipped with a fence and a door to prevent access;
- All pools must be surrounded by a fence at least 1.2m high unless the inside walls are at least 1.2 m high in the case of an above-ground pool and at least 1.4 m in the case of a pool that can be dismantled. The fence must prevent a round object of 10cm in diameter from passing.

Modification to the Bylaw on the safety of residential pools

A modification to the Bylaw on the safety of residential pools was published in the Quebec Official Gazette last May 19 and will come into effect on July 1, 2021.

An important change concerns when owners of pools constructed before November 2010 who benefitted from an acquired right will have to conform to the safety measures laid out in the Bylaw. A two-year delay is given to the concerned owners to conform to the norms (installation of a fence, gate, safety devices, etc.) which must be put in place at the latest July 1, 2023.

FIRE DEPARTMENT

Summer fire safety tips

- Never use a barbecue indoors or in a closed-in space—you are exposing yourself and your family to a risk of fire and also to toxic and dangerous gases.
- Place your barbecue far from all combustible objects or materials such as terraces, fences or plants.
- Never leave a lit barbecue unattended.
- Check your tank and propane supply lines to make sure they are well installed, then clean the run-off plate.

Things to do and not do at a campfire

- Never use gas to start a campfire and, never ever add some to the flames since those flames could follow the trail up to the container you are holding.
- Have water and a shovel on hand to put out the fire when you are done with it.
